INTERMEDIATE EGRET

Family Ardeidae
Species Egretta intermedia
Common names Intermediate Egret, Plumed Egret
Status Native vagrant
Size 640 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, White-faced Heron 670 mm)
Abundance Rare
Habitat Found along estuaries and wetlands.
Worldwide range Wide-ranging through Africa, Asia and Australia.
New Zealand range Records come from such places as the Lake Whangape and Taupiri wetlands in north Waikato, Avon Heathcote Estuary in Christchurch and in 2006 at Waiatarua Wetlands in Remuera, Auckland.

Description – breeding plumage

Upperparts and underparts White. Bill Reddish. Legs Black. Feet Yellow. Description – non breeding plumage

Bill Yellow. Legs Yellowish tibia.

Conspicuous features

- A medium sized white heron.
- Black line of gape ends level with eye unlike White Heron where it extends beyond the eye.
- In breeding plumage has ornamental filamentous plumes on back and breast.

Conspicuous characteristic

• Usually a solitary bird but sometimes associates with White Heron. Call Harsh croaks.

Nest A tree nester. It does not breed in New Zealand.

Where to find

Auckland – Waiatarua Wetland, Remuera. This is a park in the suburban city surrounded by houses. A bird has been a regular visitor here over several years. P 298.

Hawkes Bay – Ahuriri and Muddy Creek near Clive. P. 331, 332.

Expect it in similar places to that of a White Heron.
