MARSH CRAKE

Family Rallidae
Species Porzana pusilla
Common names Marsh Crake, Baillons (Bayons) Crake
Status Native
Size 180 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, Spotless Crake 200 mm)
Abundance In selected areas but secretive
Habitat A bird of swamps and wetlands and the raupo margins of lakes. It shares a similar habitat to that of the Spotless Crake.
Worldwide range Widely spread through the southern Mediterranean, Asia, Indonesia, The Philippines, New Guinea, Australia and New Zealand. In New Zealand this species is becoming better known and nests have been studied.
New Zealand range Evenly spread in both North and South Island In wetland

areas.

Description

Face, throat and breast Dark grey. Crown and upperparts Brown. Wings Brown, with black and white mottling on secondary feathers. Back Black, with some white mottling. Abdomen Horizontally streaked with black and white. Bill, legs and feet Greenish.

Conspicuous features

- Slightly smaller than the Spotless Crake.
- Undertail brown barring and white flecking on back and wings.
- Paler colouring which differentiates it from the Spotless Crake.

Call A harsh "krek krek krek" more often heard at night. This is the most common sound made by this bird but a harsh trill might also be heard.

Nest A platform of grass and twigs in a wet area, often with water under it, attached to a rush bush. Up to 5 olive-brown eggs are laid.
