

TURNSTONE

Family Scolopacidae

Species *Arenaria interpres* **Common name** Turnstone, Ruddy Turnstone.

Status Migrant

Abundance Uncommon

Size 230 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, Wrybill 200 mm)

Habitat Muddy estuaries and harbours.

Worldwide range An Arctic nesting migrant which arrives in October. Over the last forty years its numbers have increased to become the third most common migrant. Common in Australia and on the islands of the Pacific.

New Zealand range Can be expected from all shore-bird bird localities in New Zealand.

Description - breeding

Crown Brown, lightly flecked with white. **Face** Black and white. **Upperparts** Neck brown with a white V on back extending to rump. **Wings** Brown inner leading edge, black outer leading edge with white primaries. **Chin** White. **Breast** Black. **Abdomen** Clean white. **Tail** Black uppertail then white with broad black tip. **Bill** Black. **Legs** Orange.

Description - non-breeding

Upperparts and underparts A dull version of the breeding plumage.

Conspicuous features

- Black and white colours around head and breast.
- White upperwing primary feathers when bird is in flight.
- Black, white and black tail.

Conspicuous characteristics

- Enjoys washing and preening in fresh water at river-mouths.
- At high-tide roosts, seldom mixes with other species.
- Busily fossicks and flips stones when feeding.
