

Pacific golden plover Pluvialis fulva

fulva 25 cm

This mottled brown-and-goldenbuff plover is a regular summer visitor, in small numbers, to Te Whanga Lagoon, especially near Hapupu. It has a comparatively large head, a short black bill and long dark legs. Adults often develop the black face and underparts of breeding plumage before leaving New Zealand for their Siberian and Alaskan breeding grounds in April.
