POMARINE SKUA

Family Stercocariidae

Species Stercocarius pomarinus

Common names Pomarine Skua, Pomarine Jaeger

Status Migrant

Abundance Uncommon

Size 480 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, Arctic Skua 430 mm)

Habitat A coastal species which ranges into deeper waters.

Worldwide range Breeds in countries of the Arctic Circle.

New Zealand range Waters around New Zealand over summer.

Discussion Less common than the Arctic Skua but where they occur together at sea they are very difficult to separate.

Similarities of Pomarine Skuas and Arctic Skuas

- Both species come in two morphs.
- Both species have similar colouration.

Differences between Pomarine Skuas and Arctic Skuas

- The Pomarine Skua is a larger and heavier bird.
 - The tail of the Pomarine Skua is more elongated with central protruding feathers rounded.
 - The central tail feathers of the Arctic Skua are pointed.
 - The light morph of the Pomarine Skua has whiter wing-flashes.

Where to find

In similar localities as the Arctic Skua, in particular the Hauraki Gulf. P. 289.
