

## Turnstone Arenaria interpres

23 cm

Also called ruddy turnstone, this is a small stocky wader with orange legs, white underparts and tortoise-shell plumage above. During the non-breeding season the plumage on the upper body is a duller brown. Turnstones breed on Arctic coasts and migrate to the southern hemisphere for the northern autumn and winter. Over 500 visit the Chatham Islands during October-April, mainly occurring on the north coast of Chatham Island, and on the northern and eastern margins of Te Whanga Lagoon.
