Description

Face Blue-grey bare skin with red wattles below bill. Upper and underparts Grey spotted with white. Bill Tan.

Conspicuous features

- Bare blue-grey face.
- Red wattles.

Conspicuous characteristics

- Usually in flocks.
- Often noisy.

Call A raucous cackle.

Nest A cup-shaped bowl among grasses. Up to twelve pinkish-buff eggs are laid. Where to find

North Auckland – Isolated rural areas usually near farm dwellings.

South Auckland – More common in areas where subdivision is close.
