Juan Fernandez petrel: pp 60-61.

Juan Fernandez Petrel *Pterodroma externa* (Salvin 1875), Vagrant (4)
22/10/1971 Ngahinapouri, Waikato

A Juan Fernandez Petrel was picked up alive by T. Emmett in October 1971, and handed over to D.G. Berrett, a visitor from Hawaii. It was found 20 km south-west of Hamilton (Reed 1972). Mr. Berrett took it to the Auckland Museum to verify his identification as a “*Black-capped” (=White-naped) Petrel *P. cervicalis*. Sylvia Reed published a short note with this identification. This specimen, a male, was later correctly identified on 15th March 1973 by R.A. Falla (1976).

Two birds prospected nest-sites on two of the Chatham Islands during 1984-1992. It was also seen at Chatham Island in October 1997. One was found in a burrow in March 1997. It only breeds on Mas-a-Fuera Island, off Chile.

Black-capped Petrel strictly refers to *P. hasitata*, found in the Caribbean
