## INDIAN YELLOW-NOSED MOLLYMAWK

Family Diomedeidae
Species Thalassarche carteri
Common name Yellow-nosed Mollymawk
Status Circumpolar

Abundance Uncommon

Size 700 mm – 750 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, a small mollymawk)

**Breeding islands close to New Zealand** Breeds on islands to the south of the Atlantic and Indian Oceans. Does not breed close to New Zealand.

Breeding months September to April.

**Range worldwide** From north of the Tropic of Capricorn to about 55° south around New Zealand's southern islands.

**New Zealand range** A winter visitor to New Zealand waters appearing regularly off the east coast of the North Island from East Cape to North Cape.

## Description - mature bird

**Head** White. **Upperwings and back** Black. **Rump** White. **Underparts** White. **Underwing** Mainly white, with wing edges and wing tips black. **Tail** Dark grey upper and under, tipped with black. **Bill** Black, with upper edge of yellow, and orange tipped.

## **Conspicuous features**

• Underwing white, finely edged with black.

- Smaller than both Grey-headed and Bullers Mollymawks.
  Bill is the most distinctive feature being black with a yellow top edge.

   Bullers and Grey-headed have black-sided bills but with top ridges and bottom edges yellow.

## Where to find – North Island

North Auckland – Waters to Little Barrier Island in winter. P 289.

Coromandel – Whitianga Mercury Islands area on the eastern side of the Coromandel Peninsula often have Yellow-nosed quite close in to shore.

Part of Plants. In winter towards White Island from Whalstone or Change

**Bay of Plenty** – In winter towards White Island from Whakatane or Ohope Beach. P. 322.
